Cal has outgained P10 foes by the most ypg and outscored P10 foes by the most ppg. They were clearly capable of having been in the National Title game themselves as their only regular season loss came at USC, a game in which Cal had a muffed punt, a bobbled punt snap and was SOD at the USC 9 at the end. In 2003 the team was in a rebuilding state (8 ret sts) and opened 3-5 before a fast finish. This looks like a rebuilding Cal team again with just 8 starters returning. If you are expecting another middle-of-the-road Pac 10 finish, remember they were far ahead of the rest of the P10 last year and Tedford brings in many key JC's that should contribute immediately. Also, fortunate for Cal, is that while this team comes together, they have a soft early schedule which could have them favored in the first 8. They will be a much stronger team down the stretch, much like they were in 2003. They are the only P10 team to knock off USC in the last 3 years and their 2 losses to the Trojans were both close. Despite being the least experienced team in the P10, they have an outside shot at winning the conference, should everything fall into place.
