Last year Kansas had 5 losses by 6 points or less. They almost upset Texas at home, despite being down to a 4th string QB, as the Horns benefitted from a questionable pass interference call. KU, despite the close losses, surprisingly was outgained by 77.1 ypg in league play. Provided they can stay healthy at QB, something they've struggled with so far under Mangino, they should be more potent on offense. The talent difference between the #1 and #6 Big 12 North teams is minimal. Due to KU having arguably the toughest schedule of the bunch and being the only one to take on both Oklahoma and Texas from the South, we will call for a lower half finish but a much better record overall.
